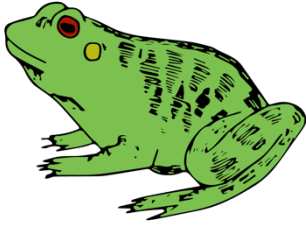
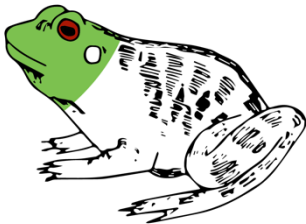


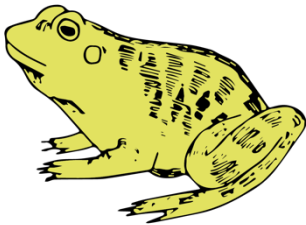
Parts of a Frog



The **frog** lives out of the water but always near it, beside lakes and ponds. Frogs are often green and brown. They catch insects with their tongues.



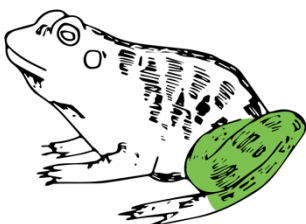
The **head** rests directly on its body. It is usually broad. The frog has no neck.



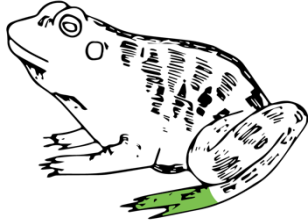
A frog's **skin** is smooth and moist. It has no hair. The skin under a frog's neck stretches so that it can croak.



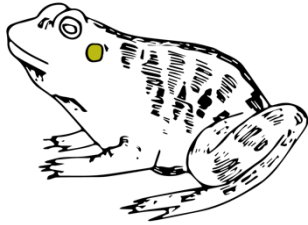
The **forelegs** are short. They are used for landing after the frog jumps. Some amphibians have no legs.



The **hind legs** are long and strong. They are used for hopping, walking, swimming, and climbing. They help the frog to push itself through the air or water.



The **feet** are used for swimming and climbing. They are webbed to help the frog swim more easily. The back feet are larger than the front feet.



The **tympanum** is the frog's ear. It is flat like the surface of a drum. It is not easily seen.
